# Western Lake Erie Basin Help

The new <u>Ohio Working Lands</u> program is available to encourage producers to establish year-round vegetative cover on eligible crop land in the Sandusky River - Western Basin of Lake Erie. The program will promote conversion, establishment and maintenance of forage/hay land on certain cropland acres.

Richland SWCD office staff will assist landowners on putting together a plan for installing these buffers. Landowners will be eligible to receive up to \$120/acre/year for a 5-year contract. The goal of the program is to reduce nutrients entering Ohio waterways to lessen harmful algal blooms in Lake Erie. Program enrollment is underway and **runs through May 1**.

### Free Milkweed Seeds

Help the Monarch butterfly by planting milkweed seeds. Milkweed is the only host plant for the Monarch Butterfly for egg laying and caterpillar rearing. It also serves as a food source for Monarchs and many other pollinator species.

Pick up free milkweed seeds and planting instructions at our office while supplies last.



# **Precipitation Monitors**

March has been another active month for Precipitation Monitors. To follow what rain and snowfall amounts they have reported, check out the Water Data Map.

Precipitation Monitors report rain and



snow amounts from work or home. This volunteer program doesn't require a lot of time. We provide the equipment and training. You just need to have access to the internet. If you want to join the Precipitation Monitor volunteer program, please contact us.

# **Voluntary Nutrient Management Plans**

We recommend that producers follow a Nutrient Management Plan to help prevent nutrient runoff. We will work with you to create the plan. If you implement and follow the plan, you'll reap the benefits.

Reasons to have a plan in place:

- Potential to reduce fertilizer costs
- Potential to increase yields
- Maximize nutrient use efficiency and minimize nutrients leaving the field
- Potentially quality for Environmental Quality Incentive Program funding for conservation practices
- Have an "affirmative defense" as stated in Ohio law against private civil lawsuits such as those brought by environmental groups if a nutrient management plan is created and the objectives of the plan are met.

The farming community is working together with Richland SWCD and others – to lead the way and show others the importance of doing their part to protect water quality. As land stewards, we are addressing a higher level of land management which will affect future generations. Contact us today to get started on creating a Nutrient Management Plan.
